

## **Evensha College**

Dear Parent/Guardian

Our second term for the academic year 2025 has been a hive of activities focusing on nurturing individuals capable to skillfully fit into the society as set by the Heritage based curriculum (HBC).

As you noted on consultation day the school has students who are differently gifted in academics. However, each student has a flare in his/her own area of study, thus bringing competition in the different disciplines hence the learners need to be applauded for their good work. While the school staff work hard to ensure improved performance by students in general, we appeal for your support on the children so that they improve in their scores especially those scoring low.

Though generally pleased in discipline with the progress of our learners academically and socially there are some elements who need an iron fist and their parents/guardians have been informed. Nevertheless, the behavior of our learners is quite encouraging.

### Fees

We thank you so much for timeliness payment of fees you demonstrated this term. This resulted in vast improvements in children's learning environment. Much as we appreciate your financial constraints, we still appeal for timely payment of fees through the usual account so that we improve structures for both staff, learners and continue to add more textbooks.

## Fencing

In the AGM, held in March, one of the resolutions emphasized was to erect a fence around the school. This has now been done thus closing out all passers by who have been a threat to the school security especially with regards to drug trafficking and the girl child since our children are getting to the stage of exploring themselves.

## Sports

In the AGM another issue of concern was failure by the school to partake in sports which in fact was due to bad state of roads caused by weather hindering movement of vehicles since the school is landlocked with wetland.

In term two academic year the school actively took part in sporting activities. We had friendly ball game matches with two sister schools, that is, Eden Graceland and Zvakwana Primary school. Our boys' volley team was outstanding in the matches.

After the friendly matches, the primary school contested in the NAPH cluster ball games competition held at Foothills Primary, the boys came up second to Foothills Primary which beat us by goal aggregate after they drew on points.

Evensha Secondary School participated in Delmonds ball games tournament held at Zimbabwe Ezekiel Guti University (ZEGU) which comprised of ten (10) private schools.

Our under-15 boys team lost in the semi-finals and the under-15 girls Volley ball team came up first (1<sup>st</sup>) position. Under-18 teams, boys and girls could not make it since our selection is limited and most of our learners are under 15.

## Chess

Under-14 and under-10, boys and girls participated in a Bindura Chess tournament held at Grace Junior. Our students in the under-14 age group, Munashe Ngoshi and Rufaro Madodo got gold and bronze medals, respectively.

## Junior Councilors Elections

In the Bindura junior councilors elections conducted at Chipindura High, our Bindura North Constituency students contested and Keavon Chiriwo, a form three (3) student was elected ward four (4) junior councilor for the term 2025-2026. The inauguration for the junior councilors, for the term, took place at Manhenga Catholic Church on 18/07/25 and 19/07/25. Dear parents help me to congratulate our junior councilor and the school wishes him the best.

## Learning and Entertainment Facilities

For a healthy learning environment, all classrooms were fitted with white boards, doors and window handles. In addition, the school procured a projector to be used for lessons to display learning materials on a big screen.

The school also purchased a TV and PA system to provide learners with weekend entertainment. The PA system will also be used on large gatherings.

## Upgrading Solar System

You may also need to be informed that the school solar system was upgraded and all classrooms now have lights. This has seen some teachers conducting evening lessons

since students are no longer studying under two roofs as was before, where all girls were in one classroom and all boys in another classroom. Each form is now studying in its own classroom, monitored by teachers.

Water supply system in the school was also upgraded, installing additional water tank and providing more water collection points.

A siren has been installed in the school so that all activities are well-timed especially in winter where people tend to be controlled by cold weather.

It should be noted that Zesa connection has not yet been activated but tubing has been done throughout the classrooms building.

### Tiling

Senior boys' toilets and bathrooms are now tiled.

### Kitchen

You may need to know that the kitchen staff has been boosted by another member who is well versed in the field. This has improved preparation of meals to be served to students and adherence to students feeding time which has been erratic.

### Educational Trip

We have planned an educational trip to Kariba. The proposed dates for the trip are from 07/11/25 to 09/11/25. The trip intends to benefit learners through seeing one of Zimbabwe's tourism attractions and at the same time students learn about food preservation methods and construction of large structures, e.g. dam walls.

We appeal to you to pay for your children, so that the trip becomes successful and so that our learners enjoy the trip with others. Please note that children learn more by seeing and doing.
